How to Pray the Rosary

- Hold the Crucifix and pray the Apostles' Creed.
- On the first large bead, pray one Our Father.
- On the next three small beads, pray one Hail Mary each.
- On the next large bead, pray the Glory Be, followed by the Fatima Prayer. Then announce the First Mystery, followed by a brief silence and one Our Father.
- On the next ten small beads, pray one Hail Mary each.
- On the next large bead announce the next Mystery and repeat the steps above until each of the five mysteries are prayed and the Rosary is finished.
- After the five mysteries are complete, pray the Concluding Prayers.
